It was with eager anticipation that twenty plus members of the congregation met with Patty Dennis, facilitator, and Rev. Julius to review what we gleaned from reading the book and to plan for the future. Some of the points were

1.The importance of prayer.

2. The need to look forward not backward.

3. The need to look outward not inward.

4. That Christ must be at the center of everything we do.

5. There is no quick fix.

We then turned our attention to the future.

1.We need to make every guest feel welcome by greeting them, helping them find a seat if necessary, inviting them to coffee and sitting and talking with them.

2. Put fear and blame behind us, and look forward to the future with hope and confidence.



#### <u>2021 MI Annual Conference</u> - A Summary

## Saturday's agenda at the 2021 Michigan Annual Conference included significant time for important legislation.

What a difference a year makes.

As business got underway, Bishop David Bard recalled, "Last year was our first attempt at a virtual annual conference and because we were uncertain about a number of aspects of the technology available to us, I asked persons who had submitted resolutions that went beyond necessary business if they would be willing to withdraw them. I remain very grateful that everyone agreed to do so in 2020."This year, we opened up the resolution process and today we will be focused on addressing resolutions submitted."

The 2020 Resolutions were not considered in legislative committees, as in previous annual conferences. They were addressed by committee of the whole in the plenary session. In 2021, members were assigned to one of eight legislative committees meeting on Tuesday or Wednesday evening on Zoom. At 6:00 pm Thursday evening, members had a Legislative Report in the inbox detailing the legislative committee action on each resolution. While Legislative Coordinator Diane Brown was not at the lectern as in previous years, she was working mightily behind the scenes. In 2020, members voted on "essential" legislation on July 27 on a paper ballot, which they then returned by U.S. Mail. Those ballots were counted on August 28 and announced by Bishop Bard on September 7, 2020. Members of the 2021 Annual Conference voted electronically, which meant the results of votes were immediately known.

On Saturday morning, the bishop reminded members of Robert's Rules of Order and the Rules of the Annual Conference and then noted, "I am committed to both keeping the process moving and to making sure we are not moving so quickly as to lose people. We will be patient with each other as we do our work."

More familiar with use of Zoom technology, after a year's worth of practice, clergy and lay members entered into debate with enthusiasm.

#### <u>Bishop Bard Appeals for</u> <u>Disaster Funds</u>



Record rainfall the

weekend of June 26-27 has left many in Michigan recovering from flooding of homes and churches. Bishop Bard appeals for gifts to the MI Conf. Disaster Response Fund.

Dear Friends in Christ in the Michigan Conference,

Last week I presided over the Minnesota Conference. When we left to travel to Minnesota, the state of Michigan was in the midst of a drought, significant in some places. Over this past weekend, the state moved from drought to deluge.

Flooding has been particularly severe in the wider Detroit metropolitan area with flooded basements and closed interstates. Wayne and Washtenaw counties seem to be the epicenter of the damage. In addition, tornadoes struck other parts of the state, though the majority thankfully touched down in low-populated areas.

In his letter to the Corinthian Jesus community, Paul writes about our interconnectedness in Jesus Christ that when one part of a body suffers, all suffer with it (I Corinthians 12:26). There is a truth there about our shared humanity. When there is suffering, we are invited to feel it, know it and respond to it in the name and spirit of Jesus.

Our tendency in such situations is often to respond by showing up. <u>While there are some limited opportunities for</u> <u>direct assistance right now</u>, I would encourage you to consider a gift to the Michigan Conference Disaster Response Fund as an initial response to this storm damage and flooding. Thank you for your prayerful consideration and for your ongoing prayers for those whose lives have been affected by this recent weather, weather which may continue to adversely affect even more people the rest of the week.

Our Michigan Conference staff and our Disaster Response Coordinator, Dan O'Malley, will keep us updated on ways we can continue to help... A semi filled with 2,080 Cleaning Kits arrived from Sager Brown Depot in Baldwin, LA this morning...We will be looking for more buckets (cleaning kits) soon. I invite you to watch for further information. I also invite you to review the <u>Michigan Conference website for</u> general information on disaster response.

When The United Methodist Church responds to disasters, our expertise through UMCOR is long-term disaster recovery. After the initial response phase, which often gets the most media attention, comes the long-term work of disaster recovery, helping people put their lives back together through direct aid and help with accessing additional resources. Know that...we are in this for the long haul. Thank you for all the ways you reach out to hurting people and a hurting world in the name of Jesus Christ.





#### <u>Piece Makers</u>



He ordered a very large metal pot to be made, to hang from the top of the church, and he ordered it to be hit forcefully with a hammer when he wanted people to assemble. Bells have come a long way since then! True story? Probably not as there is a record of bells in existence dating back to 1000-2000B.C. in China. Many years ago, Ro Van Wagoner was at a bell

performance, and she knew immediately that she would like Oxford UM Church to own bells and have a bell choir. An appointment was set up with a Malmark representative who came to the church. Plans were made and before long we had bells and two bell choirs. After our summer break, the bell choir will be back to play on the third Sunday of the month. ## <u>The Power of Listening</u>

"The most basic and powerful way to connect to another person is to listen," says Dr. Rachel Naomi Remen, author and integrative medicine professor. "Perhaps the most important thing we ever give each other is our attention."

Twice in Mark 4, while teaching, Jesus urges, "Let anyone with ears to hear listen" (verses 9 & 23, NRSV). One way we show what Jesus means to us is by truly listening to his word — not just hearing sounds but being attentive and intentional. Likewise, one way we love and serve others is by respectfully listening to them: not assuming we know what they feel or mean or will say; not planning what to say even as they're still speaking, but listening deeply to learn about them and their experience.

We often think living our faith calls for great accomplishments or worldwide reach. But Dr. Remen says, "A loving silence often has ... power to heal and to connect." Don't underestimate something as basic and doable as listening as a way to practice Christ-like love.




